

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY	Item: Community Corrections Committee – Decision Point Population Analysis Sub-Committee Quarterly Report Action Required: None. Document provided for review.
Background and Actions to Date	<p>The Community Corrections Committee (CCC) has assigned the Decision Point Population Analysis Sub-Committee (DPPA) the task of identifying the decision points of the Lane County criminal justice system. The DPPA has successfully mapped the flow of an offender through the criminal justice system, from the time of the crime report to completing a sentence (attached). The committee is now identifying the areas of greatest concern to determine the bottlenecks or choke points in the system, and those policies which unduly drive the population in the jail. Questions are being developed to use in gathering the information necessary to conduct the analysis of these decision points. Following the receipt of the data and the appropriate analysis, recommendations will be made for potential solutions to solve the problems identified.</p> <p>The DPPA will also serve as the oversight committee of the Innovative Decision Making Modeling (IDM²) grant awarded by the Technology Opportunity Program of the U.S. Dept. of Commerce. The information gathered from the DPPA will be used to develop, validate and calibrate the modeling program, to eventually be used as a tool to simulate the policy recommendations and observe the effects to the system.</p>

Pertinent Policy	<p>Local public safety coordinating councils are charged by ORS 423.565 with the following:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> (1) Develop and recommend to the board of county commissioners a plan for use of State resources to serve the local offender population; (2) Coordinate local criminal justice policy among affected criminal justice entities. <p>PSCC Goal #1 states: Have a system in place that monitors, evaluates, and recommends improvements for the effectiveness of the community safety system.</p>
