PSCC GOALS

- **GOAL #1** Have a system in place that monitors, evaluates, and recommends improvements for the effectiveness of the community safety system.
- **GOAL #2** Review governance models and make recommendations that support cooperative and coordinated approaches to community safety.
- **GOAL #3** Have a continuum of services and sanctions in place based on proven best practices that promote community safety.

STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS

- Develop and recommend a plan for the use of state resources to serve the local adult and juvenile offender population which must coordinate community wide services involving prevention, treatment, and intervention strategies;
- Coordinate local criminal and juvenile justice policy among affected criminal justice entities; and
- In consultation with the Commission on Children and Families, develop and recommend a plan aimed at crime prevention and to prevent criminal involvement by youth

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

- Identify and recommend ways to more efficiently and cost effectively manage and operate the criminal justice system in central Lane County.

The 2001-2002 required component focusing on juvenile and adult corrections was completed. Work continues into the 2002-2003 year. The effort will be lead by Health and Human Services.
